The annual Field Day was held on Wednesday, October, 22nd. The events of the day are completely covered in the Sports Section. What is worthy of mention here is the concert presented in the evening by the Athletic Association. Allan Callaghan, Vice-President of the Association was Master of Ceremonies. Highlights of the program included impersonations by F. A. Brennan and "Buddy" Maher, old time music by John Hughes and his gang and a solo by Gene Gorman. The annual Fall Retreat opened on Friday, September 13th. It was conducted by Rev. Archibald MacDonald, C. S. S. R., Rector of Holy Redeemer Church in Charlottetown.

Father "Os," as he is familiarly known about the college, has been appointed Parish Priest of Grand River. He has been professor of Greek for the past five years and has been coach of the St. Dunstan's hockey team since 1937. "Red and White" wishes him every success in his new field of labor.
