The study, made by the Harvard School of Public Health, also reveals fat boys have a

slightly better chance than fat girls of getting into college.

But they still have a tougher

time gaining admission than thin boys of comparable intel-

Helen Channing and Dr. Jean Mayer, study researchers, said although roughly the same per-

centage of thin and fat boys and girls apply to college, the fat students are accepted less

frequently, particularly the female applicants.

The two researchers said they can find no other explana-tion for the finding than col-


