With three quarters of the MIHL season gone the SDU Saints definitely have their backs against the wall. In order to make the playoffs they have to win their remaining four games in the season against Acadia, UNB, Mount Allison and the hapless University of Moncton Blue Eagles. The next three weeks will be rugged ones for the Red & White team. However, they definitely can win all four games and make the playoffs. Their record since Xmas is by no means indicative of the way that this hockey club is capable of playing. Even though we have only won two of our last eight hockey games, there is no doubt about it: we are capable of beating every other club in this league. Whether you look at it on paper, on our performance on certain games or in any way you wish we are the best team in this league and if we could just get rolling the way we can, there will be no stopping us. I believe, we started playing this way during the last fifteen minutes of the St. Mary's game. We scored three goals and we were skating, back-checking and hitting like mad. If we had five minutes more we not only would have tied the game up but probably would have won it without having to play overtime. As it was, SMU kicked one of their goals in and scored another after the puck had been on the mesh for about 10-15 seconds and the referee failed to blow the whistle. Late in the third period Dennis Affleck, rugged rear guard, threw a check that has to be described as beautiful. It was a perfectly clean check and it flattened an SMU player — he was out on the ice for approximately two minutes.

Thus if our club can keep playing like this, they will definitely win the next four games. I feel quite confident that they will do this because they know that they have to win them and it has always been the case with a Saint Dunstan's hockey club that they play their best hockey when the going is the toughest and with their backs against the wall. I am sure that we are going to keep up the pace.

Thus, come March 1, the old Red and White colors will be flying proudly at Moncton and the added spirit incentive we will pick up by making the playoff will be all we need to win 'er all — and by the night of March 2 the Red & White colors will be flying even higher and prouder.

When we win the next four games, we will have 18 points and this will be good enough for at least fourth place in the league. This is how it will likely go from now until the end of the season. St. F.X. have already clinched a playoff berth and in their next five games, they will beat STU, UNB, SMU, Dal. and Acadia, to give them 32 points for the season. The Huskies have 18 points now and in their remaining games they should defeat Dal, University of Moncton and Mt. A. while losing to Ft. F.X. — thus they will end up with 24 points. For the last two spots we now have Acadia, SDU, STU, UNB, and Mt. A. all fighting. We will win our next four to give us 18 point. Mount A. could defeat U de M and Acadia twice while losing to SDU and SMU. This would give them 16 points but 16 points will not be quite enough to make the playoffs.

Likewise, U.N.B., even though they could win three of their last six games, will not have enough points to make the grade. Thus it appears that the fourth team in the top four will be Acadia or St. Thomas. Acadia has five games remaining. They will lose to SDU, St. F.X. and St. Thomas and quite probably they will lose their other two games with Mount A. —if this is the case they will end up with 15 points and thus St. Thomas will make the playoffs. The Tommies also have five games remaining and judging by their play in the last few weeks they should win four of these, defeating UNB, Acadia, and Dalhousie twice while losing to St. F.X. This would give St. Thomas a total of 19 points, good enough for third place in the league standing. However, if Acadia should beat the Tommies, then both teams would be tied for fourth place in the standings with 17 points and at this stage of the game it looks as if the Axemen would get the nod by virtue of their margin in goals scored.

Thus it shapes up as quite a race in the MIHL for the next three weeks. However, the important thing to remember is that we can make the playoffs with four wins in our remaining games, and more important still, we will win the next four.

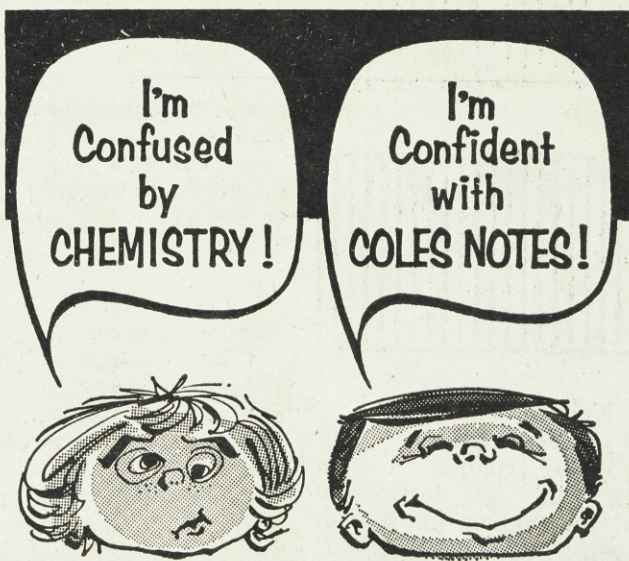
