

Statutory Declaration

By virtue of the powers vested in Sister Louis Marie, C.S.M., B.Com., B.Sc. (H.E.), Dean of Women, Principal of Marian College, and Assistant Professor of Home Economics at St. Dunstan's University, situated in the City of Charlottetown, in the province of Prince Edward Island, in the country of Canada, she has, as from the eleventh of September, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and sixty seven established as follows:

A shire, to be known as CHINATOWN, situated in the basement of Marian College. The inhabitants of the said CHINATOWN being all ladies from Hong Kong, a British Crown Colony in south-eastern China, on the South China Sea, including Hong Kong Island, Kowloon Peninsula, and a section of the Chinese mainland. Its population is 4,806,000; Victoria its capital. The inhabitants of the said CHINATOWN are ladies of high moral standing —temperate at their meals, diligent in their employment and constant in their resolutions. They are modest in dress and behaviour and their conversation is edifying. As a result of this establishment, and in view of the fact that there are many ladies who are still unaware of the existence of CHINATOWN, I deem it proper to acquaint them with the existing situation and invite them to become citizens of CHINATOWN if they so desire. I do write this declaration without any form of bias, malice, or political propaganda, conscientiously believing the same to be true and according to the STATUTORY DECLARATION ORDINANCE.

Centennial Year! Expo 67! Man and his world! Canada welcomes the world with outspread arms. But here at S.D.U. our arms are also outspread, to students from all over the world—U.S.A., Africa, Guyana, Hong Kong, and the West Indies. People on campus often ask, "Where is Guyana?" "Hong Kong, where's that?" "Where is the West Indies?" There are, this year, students from Hong Kong, one from Guyana, and two from St. Lucia in the West Indies. It will be of interest to everyone to have a knowledge of these places.

HONG KONG

Hong Kong is a British Crown Colony in southeastern China, on the South China Sea, including Hong Kong Island, Kowloon Peninsula, and a section of the Chinese mainland. Its area is 391 square miles. Hong Kong means "Fragrant Harbour". Hong Kong is one of the world's ten largest ports in terms of shipping tonnage handles annually.

The island is comparatively flat, with a few hills here and there, the 1800 foot Victoria Peak overlooking the harbour.

The official language in English, but the inhabitants also speak Cantonese, Mandarin, and Shag-hainese.

The natural curiosities are the beautiful Victoria harbour from which the island earns its name and the beaches of beautiful white sand which stretch in unmatchable beauty beneath an azure sky.

GUYANA

Most people will be surprised to know that Guyana is not an Island in the West Indies. Guyana is part of a region in Northern South America. This region is divided into British Guiana (now Guyana since its independence in 1966), French Guiana and Surinam or Dutch Guiana.

The capital of Guyana is Georgetown.

The interior is hilly, but the coastland is flat. Guyana is famed for its numerous and vast rivers, in which are several rapids and waterfalls. Navigation by steamer is quite possible for several miles upstream.

The natural curiosity of Guyana is the picturesque and stupendous Kaieteur Falls on the Potaro River. Hunting in the interior is certainly a tourist attraction. The aboriginal Indians or Amerindians who live in the interior, still maintain their own way of life and culture. When Sir Walter Raleigh dreamt of his "El Dorado" he was actually referring to Guyana.

The chief industry of Guyana is mining, and minerals like Bauxite, Gold, Silver, and Diamonds exist in large quantities. The official language is English.

The word "Guyana" means "Land of several waters."

ST. LUCIA

St. Lucia is an island in the archipelago known as the West

Indies. The West Indies stretches in a curve from the South of Florida to the North of Venezuela in South America, enclosing the Caribbean Sea.

The island of St. Lucia, 238 square miles in extent, with a population of 99,000, lies south of this archipelago. The island is often called "The Helen of the West Indies" because of its natural beauty which caused the British and French to fight fourteen battles for the possession of St. Lucia. It is now a British Colony, independent in association with Great Britain since March 1, 1967. The island is of volcanic formation, and it is very hilly and mountainous with numerous rivers and streams. There is an active volcano called "Soufriere" to the west of the island. The Sulphur Springs, several hot sulphurous springs, run at the base of the volcano. The curative properties of these waters in arthritic and rheumatic complaints are well renowned.

The capital of St. Lucia is Castries, highly situated on a land-locked harbour, one of the best in the Caribbean.

The official language is English, but the inhabitants speak French Patois, because of the French possession seven times.

St. Lucia is so named because it is said to have been discovered by Columbus on St. Lucy's Day, 13th December, 1502.

The natural curiosities of St. Lucia are the twin pitans, two lovely cone-shaped mountains which rise sheer out of the sea to the West of the island. They are clothed with luxurious vegetation from base to summit, and stand like two sentinels guarding the island.

Cystic Fibrosis is a disease found mainly in younger children which attacks the digestive and respiratory systems. Although little is known about it, about one in every thousand children is born with C.F. and more victims are claimed by it than polio. There is no known cure but it can be controlled if discovered in the early stages.

Mr. Michael Place addressed the students on Cystic Fibrosis at the Rec Centre on Wednesday night. In addition to pointing out the various symptoms which include dry skin, failure to gain weight, fatigue, emaciation, irritability and diarrhoea, he urged everyone to donate generously.

This year for the first time, a National Contest is being held with a trophy donated by McMaster University. The trophy will be awarded on a percentage basis. As there are about two hundred eighty-five Freshmen, St. Dunstan's will be a strong contender for this trophy. The results have already been sent to Ottawa and the winner should be known within a few days.

Mr. Leo Broderick, President of the Senior Class, when asked to comment, expressed his heartiest congratulations to the class of '71 on their "fine effort", and stated if they remained as enthusiastic for the coming events, St. Dunstan's can't help but have a good year. He also expressed his appreciation and thanks to the Senior Class and, in particular, to George Morrison for organizing the Shinerama.
