QUESTIONAIRE

This Questionaire was compiled and circulated by a students interest group, consisting of both P.W.C. and S.D.U. students, who are concerned about the question of Higher (university) Education on P.E.I.

The purpose of the Questionaire was to test public and, more particularly, student opinion regarding this question.

The compiled results of the Questionaire reveal some interesting facts. Without completely reiterating the revealed statistics, it is interesting to observe that 87.2% of the total of 516 people questioned feel that this question has not been adequately considered and publicized; 85.8% feel that the present plans announced by both P.W.C. and S.D.U. need further study; 95.4% feel that this total question needs further study; 83.3% would be interested in a public teachin; 87.5% see the question of Higher Education as a personal concern; 34.6% have read some or all of the proposals; and 62.2% indicate that they have seriously considered this

These facts indicate a great deal of dissatisfaction with the trends which have been developing in the field of Higher

A great deal of time and effort has been contributed by the students wno worked on this project. We only hope that the somewhat startling results of this survey do not get lost in a sea of apathy and a bureaucracy filled with self interest.
