The principle worry on campus this spring has been what seems to be a widengulf between the students and the faculty. The gulf has been created through the misunderstanding and misjudgement of both parties. The gulf does not exist between the two as professors and students but it does exist between the two groups of men who differ in their concepts of student freedom.

The students, to put it simply, we hope not too simply, feel that in matters not involving their classroom activity, they should be the sole judges of what they should and should not do. Naturally, many of the faculty disagree with the students' contention. They believe that the students are incapable of handlig their own affairs properly and that they would receive an incomplete education here at Saint Dunstan's. Others perhaps believe that they are our guardians while we are at this university and that it is their duty to keep a 'parental' eye on us.

Now there is no necessity to reiterate these problems; everyone on campus is aware of the situation. But what shall we do about it? How shall we solve the immediate problems and thus achieve the most important result — co-operation between the opposing factions?

We feel that the only way to settle these difficulties is through the present studentfaculty meetings set-up. This committee should have two parts to it, first, the regular committee which would handle general questions at weekly meetings, and second, a special committee whose function would be to work out the details of a general studentfaculty decision.

For these committees to achieve their objective, it is necessary that both groups represented be people who will be able to enter into discussion without any antagonism. The objective of these meetings would be to work for a solution agreeable to both the faculty and the students, not to attack and defend old issues and present conditions. This automatically means that neither prefects nor students with a personal gripe could be members for the temptation would probably be just too much for either of these two to resist taking pokes at the other.

We are positive that if these problems could be settled, then the co-operation which is so badly needed between the faculty and students on campus could easily be attained.
