
HOCKEY SAINTS 5-1 AT CHRIST

After humbling both Mt. Allison and Moncton last weekend, the Red and White hockey squad can claim a record of 5-1 as it breaks up for the Christmas break. The only defeat came at the hands of a strong Acadia club two weeks ago in Wolfville.

After strong preseason performances against the Junior Islanders and Dal., and two equally impressive victories over the Memorial University Beothucks in league play, the Saints ran into a spirited, hard-hitting Acadia club.

The Saints played poor positional hockey and were unable to consistently penetrate Acadia's defense, led by Ken Brown and Bobby Ring. The Island crew were hampered by numerous first period penalties and were never able to get untracked against the Axemen.

After each club scored once in the first session, the Saints played their skating brand of hockey for the only time in the contest. Unfortunately this only lasted for a period of ten minutes, but during this time they beat Ring twice to takt a 3-1 lead. The Axemen came right back and scored twice in the second period and fired home three more unanswered goals in the final frame, to win it 6-3.

The Saints didn't look much better the following day against a weak Dal. club. The Saints easily tamed the Tigers 8-4, but weren't very impressive in doing so. St. Dunstan's took a quick 4-0 lead, and the outcome was never in doubt, but it was a sloppy, unexciting game.

Whatever Jack Kane did the following week in practice worked, because the following weekend his forces looked like the class of the league as they had little trouble with highly rated Mt. A. and Moncton.

The Hawks came into the game flying high, coming off an impressive upset of the defending champs the weekend before, 6-3. It didn't take long for the Saints to shoot down the Hawks as they fired home four second period goals after leading 2-1 after the first session. Five more goals in the third frame made it 11-2.

Two days later, the Moncton Blue Eagles flew into town and their fate was the same as Mike Brown registered his first shutout 6-0. The Eagles were also coming off an upset of St. F.X. and were highly regarded as playoff contenders.

After a scoreless first period, the Saints fired home five second period goals and added a single in the third. Moncton had previously fired 53 shots on the St. Mary netminder but the low flying birds were held to a mere 14 shots on Brown while the Eagles, Paul Raymond was the target of 57 shots. This is just an indication of the performance put on by the S.D.U. blueline contingent.

It seems unlikely that the Saints will taste defeat if they can continue to play like this.

Ed Hilton's basketball Saints opened their M.I.B.L. season with a very disappointing loss at the hands of the Mount Allison Hawks, in Sackville 62-61.

The loss came as quite a shock, as the Saints were to be possible contenders for the league crown.

The Hawks combined good shooting and a ball control offense to upset the Red and White quintet. The outside shooting of guards Dave Wood and Ken Evans paved the way for the winners.

The Saints led at the half 33-24, after enjoying leads of ten & twelve points throughout the half. It seemed only a matter of time before the Saints would get untracked, in this their first game, and blow the game wide open.

With five minutes gone in the second half the Mounties, who already have three league games under their belt,

began to chip away at the S.D.U. lead and they finally caught the Islanders midway through the session.
