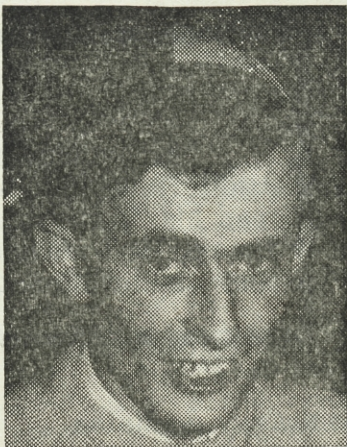


WHY DID YOU COME TO UNIVERSITY?

I don't know why, I just came.



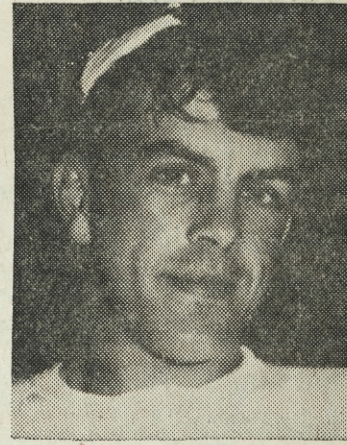
David Dugas

I wanted to have fun, meet people. I feel that one needs an education — physically, socially, spiritually and intellectually. Anyways, all my friends are going, so I came.



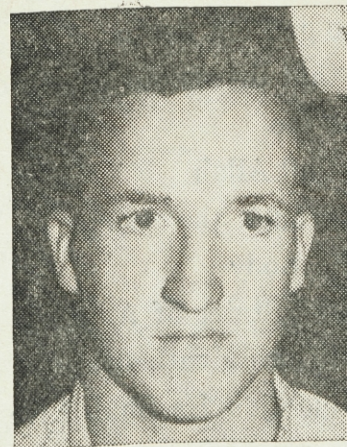
Les Zielinski
