Reverend Jean Buote

On April 1, 1941, Rev. Jean Buote passed to his Eternal Reward at the Sacred Heart Home, Charlottetown, P. E. I. He was a member of the graduating class of 1921. He was ordained to the Holy Priesthood in 1925, and for four years served as pastor at Grand Entree. In 1929 ill health forced him to retire to the Sacred Heart Home.

Though a delicate constitution hampered his priestly life, Father Buote was a man of unbounded zeal. He bent his every effort for the salvation of souls near at hand and far off in the Mission fields. We can surely say, though his career in the priesthood was short, he accomplished much in his Father's vineyard. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord.
