The Y.M.C.A. captured the City Basketball league crown on April 5, at Queen Charlotte High gym, and they did it in thrilling fashion, scoring the winning basket in the final two seconds of play. It was the third game of a best of five series, the "Y" having won the first 53-35, and the second 57-53. The final score of the third game was 54-52. Jim Gratton scored the winning basket from about twenty feet out.

With 48 seconds remaining, and the count deadlocked at 52-52, Henry Philips had a chance of putting the Saints in front with a free throw, but he missed the basket. Seventeen seconds later, Jim Gratton of the "Y" also missed on a foul shot. The Saints were given another chance with 25 seconds left, but Steve Stafford, the player fouled on, failed to score from the foul line.

It was a close game all the way, and at half time, the Y.M.C.A. five was leading by a mere three points with the score reading 29-26.

Wendell McLean spearheaded the "Y" attack with 19 points. Jim Gratton accounted for 12. Steve Stafford was big gun for the Saints with 18. Phil Mullally was the only other S.D.U. player to get in the double figures, racking up 10 points.
