Naturally there will be jocking for positions before anything can be done. Past experience is evidence enough for that. The stronger clubs will build up a case for the status quo. But failure to find a solution might mean the end of Canadian football as a spectator sport in this area.

No longer can the behemoths of the league be allowed to trample over the opposition without a whimper of discontent. The novelty of the game has worn off; Canadian football must remold itself to meet the demands of the paying customer if it is to survive.

The old stereotyped answer that people get tired of watching the same clubs playing each other more than once a year is not valid.
