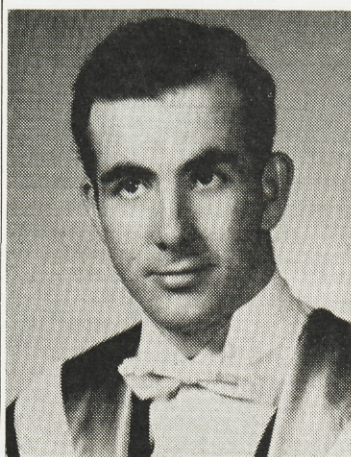

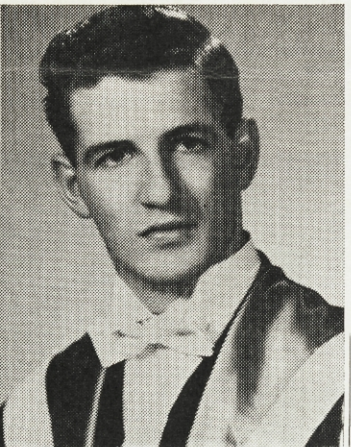
Reginald Timothy Pendergast—Arts

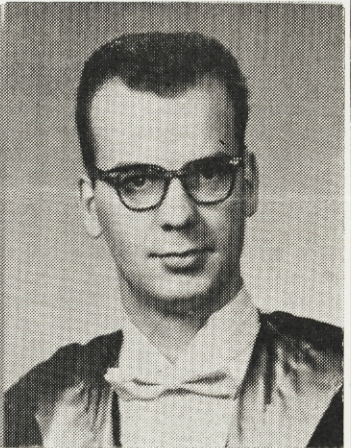
Next year Charlie will enter the teaching profession. We wish him all the best in the future.

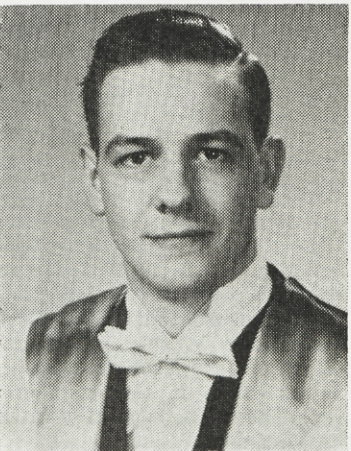


Edward R. Blanchette — Science

"Great things are achieved by great men."

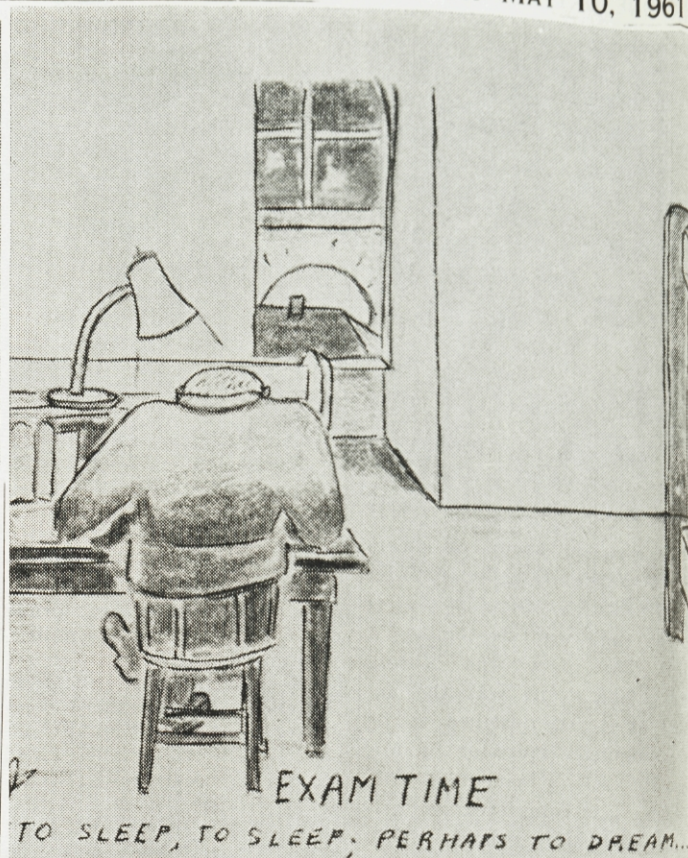
