On January 8th, 1920, a meeting of the hockey directors was held in Charlottetown and St Dunstan's sent representatives for the purpose of taking a place in the Provincial League. This is practically the first time St. Dunstan's played in the Island League and although not obtaining any victories her teams, considering the seasoned players opposing them, did not bring any discredit to their "Alma Mater."

On January 20th, the Arena rink was crowded with enthusiastic hockey-fans to see the Saints give battle to their old-time rivals, the Abbies, in the opening game of the series between Abbies, Crystals, and Saints.

The games were exceedingly fast and especially in the senior, "speed" was certainly in evidence, while the brilliant blocking and stopping added much to the play. Although the score of the senior stood 8-4 in favor of the Abbies it was no indication that they had an easy victory. The swift rushes of Williams, Callaghan and Sanchagrin, combined with the defense work of the latter two foiled many an attempt on the part of the Abbies to get within shooting distance of our nets, held by our excellent stop—Howatt.
